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Victor Valley Transit Authority Meeting Procedures

The Ralph M. Brown Act is the state law which guarantees the public's right to attend and participate in meetings of local legislative bodies. These rules have been adopted by the Victor Valley Transit Authority (VVTA) Board of Directors in accordance with the Brown Act, Government Code 54950 et seq., and shall apply at all meetings of the (VVTA) Board of Directors.

- 1. **Agendas** All agendas are posted at the VVTA Administrative offices, and the Victorville, Hesperia, Barstow and Apple Valley city/town halls at least 72 hours in advance of the meeting. Staff reports related to agenda items may be reviewed at the VVTA Administrative offices located at 17150 Smoke Tree Street. Hesperia, CA 92345.
- 2. **Agenda Actions** Items listed on both the "Consent Calendar" and "Action/Discussion Items" contain suggested actions. The Board of Directors will generally consider items in the order listed on the agenda. However items may be considered in any order. New agenda items can be added and action taken by two- thirds vote of the Board of Directors.
- 3. Closed Session Agenda Items Consideration of closed session items exclude members of the public. These items include issues related to personnel, ending litigation, labor negotiations and real estate negotiations. Prior to each closed session, the Chair will announce the subject matter of the closed session. If action is taken in closed session, the Chair may report the action to the public at the conclusion of the closed session.
- 4. Public Testimony on an Item Members of the public are afforded an opportunity to comment on any listed item. Individuals wishing to address the Board of Directors should complete a "Request to Speak" form. A form must be completed for each item an individual wishes to speak on. When recognized by the Chair, speakers should be prepared to step forward and announce their name and address for the record. In the interest of facilitating the business of the Board, speakers are limited to three (3) minutes on each item. Additionally, a twelve (12) minute limitation is established for the total amount of time any one individual may address the Board at any one meeting. The Chair or a majority of the Board may establish a different time limit as appropriate, and parties to agenda items shall not be subject to the time limitations. If there is a Consent Calendar, it is considered a single item; thus the three (3) minute rule applies. Consent Calendar items can be pulled at Board member request and will be brought up individually at the specified time in the agenda allowing further public comment on those items.
- 5. **Public Comment** At the beginning of the agenda an opportunity is also provided for members of the public to speak on any subject within VVTA's authority. Matters raised under "Public Comment" may not be acted upon at that meeting. The time limits established in Rule #4 still apply.
- 6. **Disruptive Conduct** If any meeting of the Board is willfully disrupted by a person or by a group of persons so as to render the orderly conduct of the meeting impossible, the Chair may recess the meeting or order the person, group or groups of persons willfully disrupting the meeting to leave the meeting or to be removed from the meeting. Disruptive conduct includes addressing the Board without first being recognized, not addressing the subject before the Board, repetitiously addressing the same subject, failing to relinquish the podium when requested to do so, or otherwise preventing the Board from conducting its meeting in an orderly manner.

- 2. Review Draft Board Agenda.
- a. Amend the VVTA Fiscal Year 2020-21 Capital Budget, Short Range Transit Plan, and TDA Claim to Adjust the Capital Budget for Battery Electric Buses (5).

Ms. Goff shared that the funding for this project has been a long journey, with two (2) prior FTA competitive grant applications being denied. The grants department then applied for another cycle of LCTOP and Volkswagen funds and after almost one (1) year, the Volkswagen funds were awarded. She added that these buses will take eighteen (18) months to build.

b. Amend the VVTA Fiscal Year 2020-21 Budget, Short Range Transit Plan, and TDA Claim.

At the August 17, 2020 Board meeting, the Board approved the Operations and Maintenance Contract be award to Keolis with a not-to-exceed amount of \$134,552,385, Mr. Azer explained. After completing the best and final offer negotiations, VVTA was able to reduce the amount of the contract approximately \$6.6 million. This item is a one-time reallocate of CARES Act fund to cover turnover expenses, software, office machines and computer equipment, as well as an increase in revenue hours. Mr. Kane shared that there is no restriction on CARES Act funds.

c. Unmet Needs FY20-21.

Ms. Strickert explained that this public hearing takes place every year and is a requirement of the TDA; prior to funds going back to jurisdictions for streets and

roads, an unmet needs hearing must be held to determine if transit has projects for needs that can be reasonably met. Ms. Strickert also reminded TAC that this year VVTA is the only agency still having an unmet needs hearing as Morongo Basin has agreed to use all their funding for transit.

d. Free Ride Day on Election Day.

Mr. Kane shared that this item is a request for a one-day free ride for Fixed Routes, County Routes and Paratransit to assist the community in getting to their polling places on Election day. Lastly, Mr. Kane mentioned that several other agencies are providing the same one-day free ride service.

e. Amend the VVTA Fiscal Year 2020-21 Budget, Short Range Transit Plan, and TDA Claim to Adjust the Budget for Bus Purchases/Driver Protection Barriers.

VVTA has had eight (8) class H buses on order. Ms. Goff explained that staff would like to install driver security barriers on these buses. There is no cost for installation for these barriers as the manufacturer is at a point in producing the buses that it is a simple addition.

Mr. Kane pointed out that transit operator's nationwide are being attacked more frequently and these barriers also assist with COVID-19 safety.

3. Bus stop shelters/benches/lighting.

Mr. Herrera said that the order has been placed and is being processed. Currently, the shelters in the City of Hesperia are being cleaned by VVTA.

4. SBCTA Update.

Ms. Strickert shared that VVTA's SRTP would be presented to the Transit Committee on October 15, 2020; the meeting notice will be sent out the end of this week.

5. Contractor Transition.

The transition to the new Operations and Maintenance Contractor, Keolis, has gone very smooth, Mr. Kane said. Mr. Zirges stated that new training requirements are taking place in the Maintenance department.

6. Other Business:

Transfer points – City of Hesperia and City of Victorville.

Mr. Kane explained that VVTA has been looking for property in Hesperia for a new transfer point for quite a long time and recently changed realtors to Bradco. There are a few parcels that VVTA may be interested in and are moving forward with the agent. Additionally, Mr. Kane said that things are still moving forward with the transportation center in Victorville.



SUMMARY STATEMENT

Sections 99238 and 99401.5 of the California Public Utilities Code provide that a public hearing be held to receive testimony on whether or not there are public and/or specialized transportation needs which can be met by funds provided by the Transportation Development Act (TDA). The San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA) must make this determination before it can allocate funds provided by the Act to projects other than public transit.

VVTA previously received 7 Battery Electric Buses (BEBs) which are being operated from the Hesperia division. Included in the capital plan are 5 additional BEB's for the Barstow division. Staff had allocated Sect. 5307 funds with LCTOP funds (Cycle 5) as a local match. Additionally, staff applied for a competitive Low and No Emission Grant (Low-No Program) to fund the incremental cost of purchasing a Zero Emission Bus over and above the cost of a Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) bus. Unfortunately, the grant application for the requested funds was not awarded.

To make up the difference, staff had submitted additional LCTOP funds from Cycle 6 as well as an application for VW Mitigation Trust Funds. Although a long and complicated process, VVTA was finally awarded \$900,000 from the VW program. The contract securing these funds has been fully executed.

With these funds, VVTA can now move forward with the procurement of the 5 Battery Electric Buses (BEBs) for Barstow. Accordingly, staff recommends the Board amend the project to purchase 5 Battery Electric Buses to include the VW funds.

SUMMARY STATEMENT

FTA requires 1% of the Sect. 5307 allocation be expended on security projects. Included in the FY 21 capital plan there is a project to retrofit the entire Fixed Route fleet with Driver Protection Barriers. However, these funds are not immediately available and may take up to another 6 to 9 months before VVTA has access to them.

In July of 2019, VVTA ordered 8 Class H buses. These buses are due to be delivered by the end of this year. Staff recommends taking this opportunity to buy these Driver Protection Barriers by installing them on these 8 buses. These barriers offer driver safety and security as well as a physical barrier for COVID-19. If these barriers are installed at this stage of the production EI Dorado will install the barriers at no additional cost to VVTA. Staff has prepared a cost comparison demonstrating the costs for the equipment to be reasonable and acceptable.

While the budget to purchase these buses has a small surplus it will not quite cover the entire amount of this additional capital expense of \$68,762. Staff recommends reallocating \$44,681 of STA funds (S20-VVT-02B) previously budgeted for the BEB Project Management, Technical Assistance and Work Force Development. These funds are no longer needed for the BEB project as these were part of the Low and No Emission competitive grant application that required extensive reporting after award. However, since the grants were not awarded and VW funds have been awarded to cover the gap, these funds are available to be re-assigned.

At its August 2020 meeting the Board approved awarding the VVTA Operations and Maintenance contract to Keolis Transit Services, LLC Boston, MA. The award was conditional, pending a positive outcome from the Best and Final Offer (BAFO) negotiations. The Keolis offer for the five-year contract, as of that date, was in amount not to exceed \$134,552,385. Through the BAFO negotiation VVTA was able to reduce the not to exceed amount by \$6,616,385. This reduces the five-year cost of the Operations and Maintenance contract from \$134,552,385 to the considerably lower amount of \$127,936,000.

Budget amendment includes:

- One-time contractor turnover expenses;
- Increase in hourly rate over previous contractor (250,143 revenue hours);
- Ecolane dispatching software;
- Three (3) Konica Office Copiers; and
- Fifteen (15) contractor computers, monitors, desktop printers.

Even with these additional items, the FY 20-21 budget will be almost \$3M less than the previous year's (FY19-20) Board approved budget. This action will have no impact on Local Transportation Funds (LTF).


